- ✓ Health Informatics
- ✓ Associate of Applied Science in Chemical Dependency Counseling
- ✓ Associate in Science: Health Science
- ✓ Associate of Applied Science: Human Services

- Exploration of career options as students create their own pathway through health and human services degree opportunities at North Country Community College at no cost to their families;
- Personal pathways to careers in health sciences, applied sciences and human services experienced through project-based learning, real-world experiences, mentorship, internships and workplace learning;
