### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW FOR CAMP

- Arrive at camp promptly at 9:00 AM. Pick-up time is promptly at 3:00 PM.
  Parents are invited to closing ceremonies at 2:15pm on Friday in hospital cafeteria (ground floor).
- The drop-off and pick-up site for campers is the hospital lobby at the James Street entrance. Look for the welcome banner. Camp staff will be waiting in the lobby.
- Directions: See attached sheet.
- Wear appropriate clothing that is easy to change in to and out of. For safety reasons, all campers must wear closed-toed shoes (for example, sneakers). No sandals are allowed. No jewelry is allowed other than earrings. Campers will change into hospital scrubs upon arrival to camp. Scrubs will remain at camp for the next day. Please bring a plastic or paper bag to store your scrubs and clothing at camp. Identification tags will be provided for each camper to wear while at camp.
- Do not bring any valuables, cell phones, purses, backpacks, or money. Rome Memorial Hospital, CNYAHEC, or M&T Bank will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.
- Breakfast and Lunch will be provided.
- The <u>emergency</u> phone number for parents while the campers are at the hospital is 315-338-7143.
- Campers who cannot or do not follow the camp rules will be released from camp.
  In this case, a parent will be contacted for immediate pick-up of their child.

## WEAR:

- -Comfortable clothing
- -Sneakers or shoes

## DO NOT BRING or WEAR:

- -Inappropriate or difficult-to-change clothing
- -Sandals or jewelry
- -Valuables, purses, backpacks, cell phones
- -Body-piercing jewelry, except earrings

## **BRING:**

- -A bag for your clothing

### **CAMP RULES**

# We can all have fun at camp if we do the following:

- 1. Be respectful to camp staff, fellow campers, other medical center staff, patients, and all property.

- 4. Use appropriate behavior and language.
- 5. Address all camp staff as they request to be addressed.

- 7. Follow the guidelines for what to bring and not to bring to camp.
- 8. Follow all medical center guidelines for safety, behavior, and confidentiality as covered in the orientation on Day 1.

## Directions - Rome Memorial Hospital

#### From the North:

Take Route 12 to Lowville. Then go south on Route 26 into the City of Rome. Turn left onto West Oak Street and continue on several blocks through a residential area. The second stop sign past the intersection with the flashing lights is James Street, where you will see the front of the hospital.

#### From the South:

Take Route 12 North to Waterville. Take Rout 315 to Route 12-B. Take Route 12-B to Route 233 (which is the Rome-Stanwix Road) into Rome. Rome-Stanwix Road becomes Martin Street. When you can't go any further on Martin Street, you will be at South James Street. Turn Right onto James Street, head north through the city. The hospital is on the right.

#### From the East:

From Utica, take Route 49 to the downtown Rome exit. Follow the overpass into the city, it ends in front of Fort Stanwix. At the second intersection, turn right onto James Street. Follow James Street north through the city. The hospital is on the right.

#### From the West:

Take the Thruway East to Exit 33 (Verona). After the toll booth, turn right onto Route 365 East. Turn left onto South James Street. Follow South James Street north through the city. The hospital is on the right.
